### **Health Improvement Scotland (HIS)**



Health Improvement Scotland is a government body which registers and inspects independent health care in Scotland. HIS award a grade to the service and write a report that is available to everyone.

HIS think it is very important that you are involved in the inspection process and so do we. Here are the ways you can be involved:

- Discussing the service with hospice workers. They will write down your comments
- Attending meetings with other people who are involved in hospice services and deciding what grade you would give the service.
- Filling in a questionnaire about your views on the service
- Meeting with the Inspection Officer
